

## Indonesian: Second Language WACE written examination—2010 design brief Stage 2

The Indonesian examination comprises a written examination worth 60% of the total examination score and a practical examination worth 40% of the total examination score.

### Time allowed

Reading time before commencing work: ten minutes  
Working time for paper: two hours and thirty minutes

### Permissible items

Standard items: pens, pencils, eraser, correction fluid, highlighter  
Special items: dictionaries: one combined dictionary (Indonesian/English and English/Indonesian dictionary) or two separate dictionaries (one English/Indonesian dictionary and one Indonesian/English dictionary). No electronic dictionaries are allowed.

### Additional information

Dictionaries should not contain any notes or other marks and may be inspected during the examination.

The examination is presented in a combined question/answer booklet.

<p><b>Section One</b> <b>Audiovisual/print text response</b> 40% of the written exam 1–2 audiovisual texts 1–3 related supporting print texts 5–10 questions with subparts Suggested working time: 60 minutes</p>	<p>Candidates view 1–2 audiovisual clips and related supporting print texts. Varied and contemporary texts appropriate to the units' contexts are used.</p> <p>Each text is viewed twice with a 20–30 second pause between each viewing. If there are two texts, there is a 90 second pause between Text 1 and Text 2.</p> <p>Questions and candidates' responses are in Indonesian or English as specified. Question formats may include multiple-choice, tick the box, true/false, short answer, retrieval chart, tables or forms, or require candidates to produce a variety of text types including one extended answer in Indonesian of 100–150 words.</p>
<p><b>Section Two</b> <b>Print text response</b> 60% of the written exam 2–3 print texts 3–5 questions with subparts Suggested working time: 90 minutes</p>	<p>This section contains 2–3 varied and contemporary texts such as email, letter, print advertisement, photograph which are appropriate to the units' contexts.</p> <p>Questions require candidates to produce a variety of text types including 1–3 extended answers totalling 250–300 words.</p> <p>Questions and candidates responses are in English or Indonesian as required.</p>
